Develop the skills for a rewarding career to make a real difference in the lives of others when you become an aged care support professional. Learn to support older people while maintaining their dignity by studying a CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support at Brite Institute.

This course, created in consultation with the industry, will offer increased career opportunities in aged and community care. You'll gain knowledge and experience in providing support to older people with complex needs and working with groups of older people. Working in ageing support can be both challenging and rewarding. You'll have the skills and knowledge to provide care for individuals as well as groups of older people. This course will give you the skills and knowledge including:

- *palliative and dementia care*
- *falls prevention and interventions for clients at risk*
- *service planning and delivery*
- *elderly care health and hygiene.*

Certification

At the successful completion of this course, you will receive a nationally recognised CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support under the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF).

Certification

Delivery Method

This course is delivered by a combination of online self-study learning materials, and ongoing tutor support and mentoring.

Students are required to undertake online activities and self-paced learning (approximately 16 hours per week).

Course Duration

The qualification will be delivered over nine-month period.

Assessment

To achieve qualification, the student will need to:

- Successfully complete all assessments including:
Knowledge questions, Projects, Practical assessment, Simulation / Observation

Entry Requirement

We welcome and encourage students from all cultural backgrounds, all diversities and ability, who can meet the course requirement.

- Candidates seeking to undertake this course must have:
- National Police Check – on commencement of this course all candidates are required to complete /have a current National Police Check within 6 months.
- Immunisation Evidence – Students are required to provide current Immunisation evidence prior to enrolment, i.e. influenza and COVID-19 vaccination in line with current Government Health Department guidelines.
- Course applicants must complete a Literacy, Numeracy (LLN Robot) test to ensure the required language, literacy and numeracy levels are met for the course.
- Pre-training interview with education staff required prior to enrolment.
